Writing workshop has been introduced and our Pre-K authors and illustrators have been busy composing their books and sharing with the class. In math we are learning our numbers and counting, one to one correspondence and simple patterns. We studied our five senses in science. #### Grades K-1

The Investigators are off to a great start! We have enjoyed getting to know each other and developing our classroom community in our new space.

In reading workshop we have focused on developing good reading habits, such as knowing what kinds of books we enjoy, understanding how to use our classroom library, and building our stamina for independent reading. We are also developing strategies for figuring out unknown words. In writing workshop we have shared personal experiences that could become written stories and are beginning to write books.

In math we have been establishing routines for math workshop and are developing strategies for











solving addition problems. We are enjoying working with Mrs.Lipar's class for science and social studies. In science we have explored the properties of sound and are now beginning to study properties of light. We love our STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, Math) challenges on Fridays.

In social studies we have been learning about ourselves and developing classroom expectations, and we are now learning about where we live and map skills through a project where we are making Texas travel brochures. Some of our major topics for next month will be writing personal narratives, features of nonfiction text, subtraction strategies, using sound and light in communication, American government, and the upcoming election.

#### Grades 1-2

We are really enjoying our new space. The class is getting comfortable in our Jungle by getting cozy in our reading hut and on our new window seats. Thank you to the Schustereder and Peebles families for your generous donations to our classroom. The kids love their new leopard paw author's chair, and I really appreciate my new leopard print read aloud chair and tall bookshelf. They are awesome! We have voted and decided to keep our class name The Explorers.



Our first month was spent going over procedures and expectations of the classroom. We worked together to create our classroom rules and consequences. The class focused on kindness and friendship during our council sessions. We discussed the importance of being a good friend to others.

In reading workshop the class learned how to choose just-right books and find a quiet place to read and stay focused. We went over reading strategies that students can use to help them in reading. Developmental Reading Assessments were completed on all students to aid in teaching. In our writing workshop we focused on how to get started by creating a list of writing inspirations and a heart map of topics to use in their writing pieces. The class was also introduced to a topic map to stretch their topics further. They are working to add more details to their writing.

In math workshop the focus has been on place value, expanded notation, math vocabulary, adding and subtracting on a number line and comparing numbers using greater than, less than and equal to symbols. During math workshop the class works in teams to complete four math station activities throughout the week. They are also offered a challenge activity for each rotation if they choose to complete it.

We are fortunate to be working with Mrs. Phipps' Investigators this year for science and social studies. We are completing various activities in science lab as we are studying sound and light. The teams are exploring sound waves, vibration, shadows, and how light behaves with opaque and transparent objects. They are creating devices to experiment with these elements. We also work together on a STEAM (science, technology, engineering, art and math) challenge every Friday where the students have to complete a challenge that is









presented using specific materials. It has been exciting to observe them in action as they figure out how to manage their time and materials to work together to complete their challenges. They have shown us their leadership, organization, creativity and thinking processes as they work through the activities and present them to the class. We have had some valuable discussions about what they have learned.

In social studies the class has been learning about the state of Texas by creating travel brochures. They are incorporating maps, symbols, a map key and various pictures and information about the places to visit in Texas. Their goal is to present a brochure that entices people to travel to our state.

We will continue to use reading strategies and book talks as we move forward in reading. The class will also be encouraged to stretch their writing during our conferences. They will work on building a strong foundation in writing through prewriting, organization and using resources to extend their topics.

In math we will continue to build on skills taught as we work with fact families, word problems, practice skip counting, relate addition and subtraction and practice repeated addition as it relates to multiplication. We will continue our study of light in science and transition to organisms, plant and animal parts, and life cycles. In social studies we will continue our unit on geography and community and then move to American government and leaders.

Thank you for your support and patience as we started our school year in new surroundings. It has been a smooth transition, and we appreciate all of your help and cooperation. ## Grades 3-4

Wow! Mrs. Smith's third and fourth grade class is off to an awesome start! We are super excited to be in our new spacious classroom. The first order of business for our class was to come up with a class name—The Calculation Crew.

Our crew has been busy in reading workshop organizing all of our picture books and novels, spending lots of time getting to know what's in our library, finding just right books, and learning that it is okay to abandon a book so we can find the perfect book to get lost in for longer periods of time. Writing workshop has taken off full



force with several of our young authors writing fantasy stories and sharing on a daily basis. Many students are writing chapter books, and we've all come to anticipate the next chapter's action in our peers' writing.

In math place value has been the name of the game. We have practiced expressing, comparing, and ordering numbers. Thanks to Worker Bee Wednesday and all of the parent volunteers, we've enjoyed playing a variety of games that have been prepared for us on those days—Race to 100, Place Value Battleship, and U-Know Place Value cards. Science has been all about STEAM activities (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math). Students engaged in activities challenging them to synthesize all of those skills: recycling paper, working as a large group to engineer a lifting mechanism, and discovering how sound travels through different materials.









In social studies we have reviewed map skills as well as completed a community service project in which we collected cat and dog food for local animal shelters. A big THANK YOU goes out to all of the community members who have presented and share their talents in our classroom. Mrs. Rebecca Masciola shared her love for quilting with us and showed us how to embroider. We learned that quilts tell stories and this helped us tell our own personal stories in writing workshop. Mrs. Dawn Knight spent an afternoon with us explaining how she started Rufus Refuge, a non-profit organization that rescues abandoned animals and helps them get adopted to loving homes.

As we move into October, we will continue to bring in the community into our classroom as Mr. Richard Schimmel will visit with us and explain not only how airplanes work, but about his career as a commercial airplane pilot. ## Grades 5-8 Language Arts and 7-8 Social Studies


The school year is off to a great start! We are enjoying "the den" and our bookshelves full of possibilities.

In fifth and sixth grade students have settled into the routines and procedures of reading and writing workshop with ease. They have enjoyed listening to our first read aloud of the year, *Pax* by Sara Pennypacker. The story of a fox and his boy has allowed for rich discussion about the love we have for our pets and the empathy we feel for the boy, Peter. Students are eager to read



their own books during reading workshop each day and have already started a book wish list for our classroom library! In writing workshop students are revising their personal narratives which are centered around a memorable moment. We have been focusing on plot structure and elaboration in order to make our stories more enjoyable for the reader. Students love to share their writing during author share time. In the coming weeks students will publish their personal narratives in writing workshop and will begin reading roundtable discussions during reading workshop.

In seventh and eighth grade we have been reading and unpacking poems each day. This has led to rich discussions regarding author's message and structures that enhance poems. Students are immersed in books during reading workshop and enjoy recommending books to classmates. In writing workshop students are drafting their first piece of writing, a free-verse

## Grades 5-8 Math and Science and 5-6 Social Studies

What an amazing start to school year! Mrs. Williams' classes are having a blast in their new spacious classrooms.

Our 5th and 6th grade class began the year by selecting their class name. After much debate and discussion the class settled on The Einsteins, at least for this trimester. The Einsteins have been hard at work in math. We have studied place value, adding and subtracting fractions, and integers.



Science has been all about STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Mathematics) activities. Students learned the phases of the engineering design process and applied it by designing catapults and wind-powered transportation devices. During our study of the 50 states, students created state flip books and worked in groups to write songs of the states and their capitals. As we move

into October we will continue working full "STEAM" ahead in math and science. In social studies our focus will shift from geography to the American Revolution.

The 7th and 8th grade class has also been hard at work in math. Our 7th graders have been hard at work learning about angles and triangles. In 8th grade, linear equations have taken over. Our focus in science has been utilizing STEAM activities to


